Register

October 26, 2024: Deadline to register to vote.

**Postmark deadline for voter registration is October 21, 2024.*

Voting

Absentee ballots are available for voters with a valid excuse.

October 26, 2024: Early voting begins. Deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail.

November 3, 2024: Early voting ends.

November 4, 2024: Deadline to request an absentee ballot in-person.

November 5, 2024: Election Day. Deadline to return an absentee ballot.

November 12, 2024: Deadline to receive absentee ballots if postmarked on or before Election Day.

ID Requirements

New York does not require a photo ID to vote in an election. However, identification is required for first-time voters or if a registration is incomplete.

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
