Nine out of 10 small businesses face a massive tax hike if the 20% Small Business Deduction is allowed to expire this year.





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

## Leveling the Playing Field with Tax Rates in Georgia

The Small Business Tax Deduction allows small businesses to deduct up to 20% of their business income, providing relief for Georgia's small business owners.
