
The 20% Small Business Tax Deduction and Its Big Impact on North Dakota



Leveling the Tax Rate Playing Field in North Dakota

The Small Business Tax Deduction allows small businesses to deduct up to 20% of their business income, providing relief for North Dakota's small business owners.

Without action from Congress, this deduction expires in 2025 while the tax deduction for larger corporations remains.
