
The 20% Small Business Tax Deduction and Its Big Impact on South Carolina

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

Leveling the Playing Field with Tax Rates in South Carolina

The Small Business Tax Deduction allows small businesses to deduct up to 20% of their business income, providing relief for South Carolina's small business owners.

Without action from Congress, this deduction expires this year while the tax deduction for larger corporations remains.
